Century of Black Mormons is a digital history database designed to identify all known black Latter-day Saints baptized into the faith between 1830 and 1930. Dr. Reeve's presentation will focus on three lessons that have emerged from the database, including what it teaches us about racial passing in the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, about segregated and integrated worship, and enslavement.
